### 4-H ECOP Task Force on Defining and Reporting the 4-H Learning Experience

Chris Boleman and Woody Hughes, Jr. reported on the 4-H ES237 discussion that has been share from the region to the 4-H ECOP Task Force. The group is utilizing the "Designing the 4-H Learning Experience: A Framework for Learning and Teaching in 4-H" as a foundation for the discussion about the 4-H ES237. The group will examine the following components: 1. what is the definition of the 4-H positive youth development framework? and 2. How does it link to the challenges of the day? Once consistent learning experiences have been defined, the group can begin to identify categories for participation numbers.

#### **Global Youth Summit**

Janet reported that the Global 4-H Youth Summit will be held from July 11-14 in Ottawa, Canada, 4-H youth, leaders and professionals from 70 countries around the world will have an unprecedented opportunity to showcasing 4-H to a national and global audience. Canada's 150th birthday celebration will coincide with the 4-H Global Network Summit in the Nation's Capital, providing an ideal backdrop for coast to coast engagement of 4-H Clubs, rural and communities and the Canadian agricultural sector. Janet reported that presentations have been selected in December. Jim Lindstrom, Global 4-H Board Member from the University of Idaho and Erin Smith, Program Director of 4-H Canada, are co-chairs for the 2017 Global 4-H Network Summit Program.

Arch reported that the total number of US participants will be 100. The 4- H Program Leadership Working Group (PLWG) met and discussed the options for selection and determined they would opt to allow those accepted as presenters as first choice to be included in the number with limitations and then regionally determine participation numbers for youth, volunteer leaders and professionals. A count has been received by state and a request for names of those accepted as presenters has been made. This information will be shared with the five regional state 4-H program leader PLWG representatives ASAP. Each region will then be given a number of youth and adult participants and it will be up to them to determine a selection process regionally. Registration and payment of fees is the responsibility of the individual once selected unless a region or state has indicated other payment options.
